
The fair will give attendees opportunities to have their emergency preparedness questions answered. Additionally, they will come away with handouts contain-

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

### **Dryer Vent Cleaning is Important**



Regular dryer vent cleaning is very important. This task is frequently overlooked by many people today, but it is important. Many people clean the lint trap in the dryer after they do a load of laundry, and think this is good enough. However, this is not the same as dry vent cleaning.

One of the main reasons is that lint within the dryer vents is actually a fire hazard. Many home fires are caused each year by dryer hoses that are blocked by the lint. The US consumer product safety commission studies have shown that dryers with too much lint cause over 15,000 house fires every year.

Cleaning the lint trap after each load of laundry is helpful but it does not do anything for the lint that is already in the ductwork. Therefore, it is important to perform regular dryer vent cleaning.

You will need to disconnect the dryer from the ductwork to be able to access the ductwork. This can be a difficult job, depending on the length of the ducts. If you cannot reach all the lint with a broom or vacuum cleaner, you should hire a professional service. This is important to make sure the vent is completely cleaned out.

Regular dryer vent cleaning is important for preventing fires, and also keeping the dryer working properly. Dryer vents should be cleaned out every 12-18 months, and you will avoid a potential fire hazard.

The community pools are open Sunday thru Thursday 10am – 9pm and Friday / Saturday 10am – 10pm (As a reminder, Pool Maintenance days will be on Mondays and Tuesdays of each week).

May 31st – August 26th Daily (Closed on Tuesdays for Mainte-



Each Monday and Tuesday, three of the six community pools will be closed for treatment and maintenance by the Premier Communities onsite staff. dents at a cost of \$25 for each card. If you rent your home within the VOWS community and wish to acquire a pool access card, you must present a completed Tenant Authorization Form. The forms may be obtained at the onsite management office.

All residents MUST utilize their pool access cards to access the pools and restroom facilities. Please do not open the gates for patrons without a valid access card and please do not ask other residents to let you into the pool areas. As in past years, pool security monitors will be checking with each pool patron to ensure that their pool access card is active. Inactive or invalid pool access cards may remain with security. These cards will be provided to the Premier Communities onsite management office on a daily basis.

Reminder to follow Pool Rules – Please ensure that all persons utilizing the pools strictly adhere to the posted pool rules. Pool rules are posted at each of the pool locations and on the community website (www.wood-landspringshoa.com). All residents and their accompanied guests are responsible for knowing and adhering to these rules. The rules have been established for the general safety and enjoyment of everyone using the pool facilities. In the event that any resident or accompanied guests fail to adhere to any of the posted pool rules, they will be asked to vacate the pool premises. Residents continually and consistently in violation of the established pool rules risk revocation of their pool access privileges. Additionally, vandalism of any degree will not be tolerated at the pools, restrooms, or other common community areas.

Swim lessons will be available this pool season to residents. These swim lessons are taught by the VOWS lifeguard vendor prior to the daily opening of the Slide Pool location. For information on registration, costs, and scheduling, please visit www.bearfootmgmt.com/activities/swimming-lessons.


Early morning lap swimming is again available at designated pools. If you are interested in early morning access to the lap pools, please contact the Premier Communities onsite management office.

Please be advised that residents with unpaid assessments will not have access to the pools. # VOWS Yard Maintenance Guidelines

Now is the perfect time of year to tackle the following landscape chores: ornamental grass cutback, tree pruning, perennial cutback, rose pruning, irrigation checks, and most importantly - pre and post emergent (weed control).

Please note: Weeds will be particularly bad this spring. We had a very mild winter for the past two years and weeds have gone dormant, but not died. As such, please make sure you are doing everything you can to be a good neighbor and keep your weeds under control.

# Here is what VOWS CC&R's have to say about Yard Maintenance:

**5.3.3 Yard Maintenance.** Each owner/resident, at their own expense, must maintain the yards on his lot with an appearance that is commensurate with the existing standards of the neighborhood.

Specifically, each owner must:

- a. Maintain an attractive ground cover of grass or sod on all yard visible from a street. Xeriscape or ground cover other than grass or sod shall be permitted with prior ACC approval.
- b. Maintain a minimum of one(1) tree in the front yard.
- c. Maintain in good working condition all lawn irrigation systems.
- d. Edge the street curbs, sidewalks and driveways at regular intervals.
- e. Mow the lawns and grounds at regular intervals.
- f. Prevent lawn weeds or grass from exceeding 6 inches in height.
- g. Not plant vegetable gardens that are visible from a street.

**5.2.8 Rear Yard Maintenance.** The Owners and occupants of any Lots at the intersections of streets or adjacent to parks, playground or other facilities, and any other Lots, where the rear yard is visible to public view must maintain the rear yard so as not to be unsightly when viewed from the street, adjacent parks, playgrounds, neighboring Lots, or other facilities. The ACC is the arbitrator of acceptable appearance standards.

### **Woodland Springs Homeowner's Association**

The purpose of a homeowners association (HOA) is to maintain, enhance and protect the common areas and interests of the subdivision or neighborhood. Individual homeowners, as members of the association, pay periodic assessments support & utilize neighborhood amenities (pond, pools, parks, tennis courts, etc.). The assessments pay for community expenses such as entrance monuments, landscaping, amenities like clubhouses, tennis courts, or walking trails, insurance for commonly-owned structures and areas, an on-site management company, or any other item delineated in the governing documents or agreed to by the homeowners' association.

Currently, the Advisory Committee, which is comprised of elected residents, is the intermediate group between the residents and the Board of Directors and Centurion American (VOWS developer). This will continue until full development of VOWS is completed. The sub-committees report to the Advisory Committee. All residents are invited to attend Advisory Committee meetings which are normally held the 4th Tuesday of each month at 6:30 pm at the Amenity Center on Timberland.


