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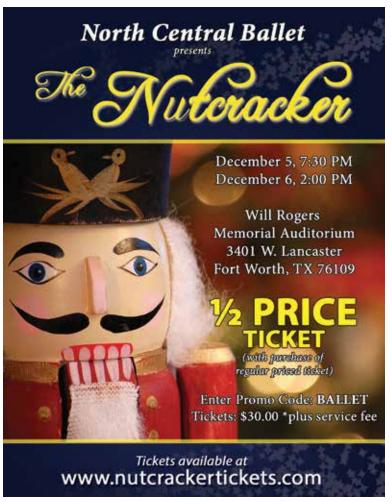

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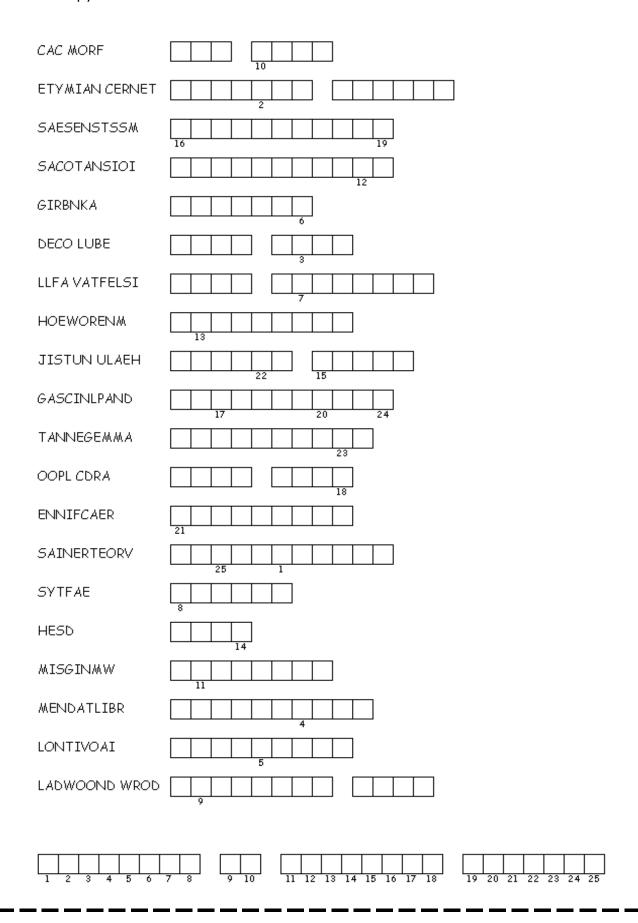
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Justin's Double Puzzle

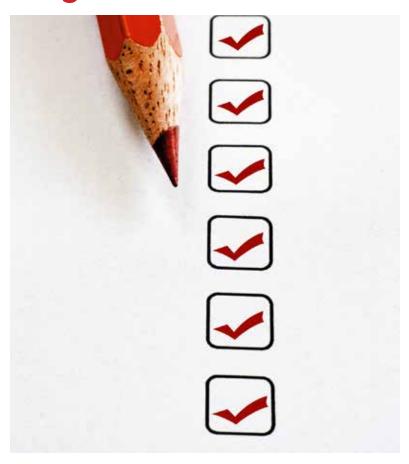




10 Ways to Avoid Receiving a Violation Letter

- 1. Trash pickup is on Monday. All trash bins must be removed from view of the street by 12:00 AM on Tuesday.
- 2. Park utility trailers in your garage or behind your fence and out of view from the street.
- 3. Apply to the Architectural Control Committee for approval before making any exterior changes to your home or lot.
- 4. Apply to the Architectural Committee for approval before placing a storage building in your yard.
- 5. Keep flowerbeds free from weeds and grass.
- Keep lawn under 6 inch height; edge your walkways and driveway.
- 7. Keep all toys (including basketball goals) behind your fence and out of view from the street.
- 8. A basketball goal can be placed in your driveway only, not on public sidewalks, in a street or cul-de-sac.
- Park your vehicles in your driveway. If you park in the street, parking in front of mailboxes and over sidewalks is not permitted. Park only in front of your lot and on your side of the street.
- 10. Holiday decorations can be displayed up to one month before the holiday, but must be removed no later than 2 weeks after the holiday.

Your HOA Compliance Liaison will be driving the community to ensure all standards are met. Please take the time to make sure you are in compliance with the DCC&R's. If you have any questions, please contact the HOA Management Office at 817-741-1719.



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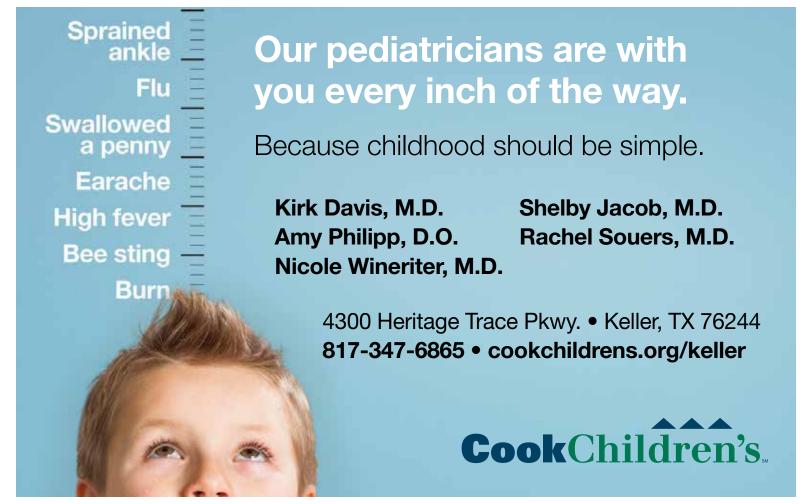

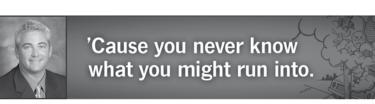

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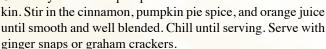
Holiday Party Season is Coming!

Show up to any gathering with these crowd-pleasing recipes!

Pumpkin Dip

- 1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese, softened
- 2 cups confectioners' sugar
- 1 (15 ounce) can solid pack pumpkin
- 1 tablespoon ground cinnamon
- 1 tablespoon pumpkin pie spice
- 1 teaspoon frozen orange juice concentrate

In a medium bowl, blend cream cheese and confectioners' sugar until smooth. Gradually mix in the pump-





Spinach-Cheese Swirls

- 1 sheet Puff Pastry
- 1 egg
- 1 tablespoon water
- 1/2 cup shredded Muenster cheese or Monterey Jack cheese
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 1 green onion, chopped
- 1/8 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 (10 ounce) package frozen chopped spinach, thawed and well drained

Thaw pastry sheet at room temperature 40 minutes. Preheat oven to 400 degrees F. Mix egg and water. Set aside. Mix Muenster cheese, Parmesan cheese, onion and garlic powder. Unfold pastry on lightly floured surface. Brush with egg mixture. Top with cheese mixture and spinach. Starting at short side, roll up like a jelly roll. Cut into 20 (1/2 inch) slices. Place on baking sheet. Brush with egg mixture.

Bake 15 minutes or until golden. Serve warm or at room temperature. Makes 20 appetizers.

Crab Stuffed Mushrooms

- 1 pound fresh mushrooms
- 7 ounces crabmeat
- 5 green onions, thinly sliced
- 1/4 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1/4 teaspoon dried oregano
- 1/4 teaspoon ground savory
- ground black pepper to taste
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 1/3 cup mayonnaise
- 3 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese
- 1/4 teaspoon paprika

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).

In a medium bowl, combine crabmeat, green onions, herbs, and pepper. Mix in mayonnaise and 1/4 cup Parmesan cheese until well combined. Refrigerate filling until ready for use.

Wipe the mushrooms clean with a damp towel. Remove stems. Spoon out the gills and the base of the stem, making deep cups. Discard gills and stems. Fill the mushroom caps with rounded teaspoonfuls of filling, and place them in an ungreased shallow baking dish. Sprinkle tops with Parmesan and paprika.

Bake for 15 minutes. Remove from oven, and serve immediately

Cranberry Punch

- 1/3 cup white sugar
- 1 quart cranberry juice
- 2 cups unsweetened pineapple juice
- 3 tablespoons almond extract
- 1 (2 liter) bottle ginger ale



In a large container, mix together sugar, cranberry juice, pineapple juice and almond extract. Refrigerate for 1 day. To serve, pour juice mixture into a punch bowl. Stir in ginger ale.

This could always be turned into an adult beverage by adding some Citron Vodka.

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Woodland Springs Homeowner's Association

The purpose of a homeowners association (HOA) is to maintain, enhance and protect the common areas and interests of the subdivision or neighborhood. Individual homeowners, as members of the association, pay periodic assessments support & utilize neighborhood amenities (pond, pools, parks, tennis courts, etc.). The assessments pay for community expenses such as entrance monuments, landscaping, amenities like clubhouses, tennis courts, or walking trails, insurance for commonly-owned structures and areas, an on-site management company, or any other item delineated in the governing documents or agreed to by the homeowners' association.

Currently, the Advisory Committee, which is comprised of elected residents, is the intermediate group between the residents and the Board of Directors and Centurion American (VOWS developer). This will continue until full development of VOWS is completed. The sub-committees report to the Advisory Committee. All residents are invited to attend Advisory Committee meetings which are normally held the 4th Tuesday of each month at 6:30 pm at the Amenity Center on Timberland.
