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COVENANT CORNER

With all of the storms we had in 2015, there are a lot of new roofs going up. VOWS has two approved roof colors: Weathered Wood and Weathered Slate. If you want to install a roof that is not one of these colors, please remember that you will need to apply to the ACC prior to any work beginning. You can find the ACC Modification request on the VOWS website or you can call or email the office at 817-741-1719 or Jackie.Morrow@fsresidential.com and we will be happy to send you one.

Here's what your CC&R's say about roofing:

5.3.2 Exterior Accessories, Surfaces & Roofing. Installation of all exterior items and surfaces, including address numbers, decorative hardware, external ornamentation, lights fixtures, and exterior paint and stain, is subject to the ACC's prior approval, including approval of design, color, materials, and location. Roofing shall be of a substance acceptable to the City, shall be covered by a manufacturer's warranty of at least 20 (twenty) years. The approved colors for roofing shingles are Weathered Wood and Weathered Slate or as determined by Board or ACC.

If an existing roof (installed prior to September 1, 2010) has a different color which was not approved by the ACC prior to installation it is a nonconforming color. The next roof installed on this home must comply with one of the two approved colors unless the ACC grants a variance.



Please welcome our new HOA staff members to The Villages of Woodland Springs.


Jackie Morrow is your new Administrative Assistant. Among her duties will be assisting the community with general information, pool cards, Amenity Center reservations and architectural request submittals.

Here are some important facts to remind our teens:


• The VOWS parks close at 10pm

- KISD has on duty security patrolling their property (and security cameras)
- Curfew is in effect for teens 16yrs. and under at 11pm Sunday – Thursday and at Midnight Friday and Saturday nights

As Citizen's on Patrol we encounter some of these violations weekly. We ask that you remind your teens to respect the law. We are eyes and ears only, but work directly with the Fort Worth Police Dept.



You Can Help Save the Monarch Butterfly

Monarch populations are down 90% and they are near extinction because of loss of agricultural areas, pesticides and herbicide resistant crops. We are killing off the native plants, which in turn affects the very wildlife we count on for pollination. Because of this cycle and its effect, a federal initiative has been formed to address and correct this dire situation. Texas plays a huge part in life of a monarch as it is part of the central flyway that monarchs take each year between Canada and Mexico during their migrations. One of the most important goals is to replant native plants and here in Texas one of the most important is milkweed. Monarch butterflies need milkweed plants to lay their eggs in and it's the only food source for the caterpillars. Each of us can help the monarch butterfly population and it's as easy as planting milkweed in any sunny spot in our yards or in common areas of our communities. Last year I bought and distributed several organic milkweed plants in my neighborhood and can't wait to see them come back this year. Because pesticides are part of the overall problem I bought locally grown, organic milkweed.

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Woodland Springs Homeowner's Association

The purpose of a homeowners association (HOA) is to maintain, enhance and protect the common areas and interests of the subdivision or neighborhood. Individual homeowners, as members of the association, pay periodic assessments support & utilize neighborhood amenities (pond, pools, parks, tennis courts, etc.). The assessments pay for community expenses such as entrance monuments, landscaping, amenities like clubhouses, tennis courts, or walking trails, insurance for commonly-owned structures and areas, an on-site management company, or any other item delineated in the governing documents or agreed to by the homeowners' association.

Currently, the Advisory Committee, which is comprised of elected residents, is the intermediate group between the residents and the Board of Directors and Centurion American (VOWS developer). This will continue until full development of VOWS is completed. The sub-committees report to the Advisory Committee. All residents are invited to attend Advisory Committee meetings which are normally held the 4th Tuesday of each month at 6:30 pm at the Amenity Center on Timberland.
