VOWS Fall Garage Sale September 27, 28 and 29

The Villages of Woodlands Springs Fall Garage Sale will take place on September 27, 28 and 29. Remember you will need to get a permit from the City of Ft Worth to participate in the sale. There is no cost to do this. You can download the form by going to www.fortworthtexas.gov. Click on the link for Permits. You may also get a permit by phone by calling 817-392-2222.

Permits shall be secured at least 72 hours prior to the sale and shall be prominently posted on the premises during the sale.

One sign advertising the sale is allowed on the premises only, and must not exceed 2 square feet in size. All other signs, either on or off the premises, are prohibited.

No more than two sales on the same premises in any one calendar year.

Here are some tips for a successful garage sale:

- All items should be clean, polished, and in good repair. A little wear and tear is OK, but don't knowingly sell damaged items which could potentially injure the purchaser.
- Practical household goods, bicycles, children's toys and clothes, sports equipment,



and garden tools are highly popular items. Clothes should be marked by size and hung on a temporary rack to allow shoppers to easily look at garments. Adult clothes are usually less appealing, so price them accordingly.


- Set up your items in a visually appealing, easily accessible manner. By neatly and attractively merchandising what you have for sale, the value of the items will appear enhanced.
- Cluster things in categories. Place the most desirable items in the back so browsers are urged to look at other merchandise on their way to the more exciting items.

- Locate any appliances where you have ready access to electrical power to allow potential buyers to try before they buy. If you have large, heavy items such as furniture, tires, etc., place them near the curb to make loading easier. If it's a hassle to get something out of your driveway and into a buyer's vehicle, a fickle shopper may decide it's not worth his or her time and move on.
- Have bags, boxes, newspaper, or bubble wrap on hand to wrap glass and fragile items.
- Post a notice that all sales are final. It's not advisable to accept personal checks – stick with cash. Get several rolls of coins and small bills in mixed denominations to make change. And keep your cash box in a protected location.
- If you're having a joint sale with several neighbors in one location, designate one person to manage the cash box, and another person to record sales in writing. This will help keep track of what items are sold, make it easier to distribute proceeds at the end of the sale, and avoid any disagreements.


COVENANTS CORNER

Trash Carts: Pick up and Storage

Fort Worth provides residential curbside garbage pickup one time per week in the resident's choice of three brown cart sizes. The city also offers weekly collection of recycling in the blue carts and yard waste in the green carts. All weekly collections take place on Monday of each week.

For items that are too large, heavy or bulky to fit into the brown garbage cart, curbside collection is made the week of the 1st Monday of each month.

- All garbage must be contained in garbage bags within the brown cart.
- The lid must be completely closed.
- Overstuffed carts will not be picked up.
- Bags left outside the cart will not be picked up (except city-issued "Pay Bags").
- The cart must be at the curb by 7 a.m. on your pickup day.
- You may set out your cart after 6 p.m. the night before your pickup day.
- Place cart so that the handle faces your house and the se-



rial number faces the street.

- Place cart a few inches from the curb or edge of the street; do not place cart in street.
- Retrieve cart from curb by midnight on your pickup dav.
- City ordinance requires residents to store carts so they can't be seen from a public street while standing in front of the house.

Please see the chart from the City of Forth Worth on proper placement of carts.

Here is what your HOA DCC&R's state about trash storage:

5.2.3 Dumping. No Lot or other area on the Property shall be used as a dumping ground for rubbish or a site for the accumulation of unsightly materials of any kind, including, without limitation, broken or rusty equipment, disassembled or inoperative cars, other vehicles or discarded appliances, furniture and/or grass clippings. Trash, garbage or other waste shall not be kept except in sanitary containers. All incinerators or equipment for the stor-

age or other disposal of such material shall be kept in clean and sanitary condition. Materials incident to construction of improvements may be stored on Lots during construction so long as construction progresses without undue delay.

Your HOA Compliance Liaison will be driving the community to ensure all trash carts are stored properly. Please remember to place your cart in the proper location so that you do not receive a letter from the HOA.



Fruit Salsa with Cinnamon Chips

- 2 kiwis, peeled and diced
- 2 Golden Delicious apples - peeled, cored and diced
- 8 ounces raspberries
- 1 pound strawberries
- 2 tablespoons white sugar
- 1 tablespoon brown sugar 3 tablespoons fruit pre-
- serves, any flavor10 (10 inch) flour tortillasButter flavored cooking
- Butter flavored cooking spray
- 2 tablespoons cinnamon sugar

Directions

- 1. In a large bowl, thoroughly mix kiwis, Golden Delicious apples, raspberries, strawberries, white sugar, brown sugar and fruit preserves. Cover and chill in the refrigerator at least 15 minutes.
- 2. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).
- Coat one side of each flour tortilla with butter flavored cooking spray. Cut into wedges and arrange in a single layer on a large baking sheet. Sprinkle wedges with desired amount of cinnamon sugar. Spray again with cooking spray.
- Bake in the preheated oven 8 to 10 minutes. Repeat with any remaining tortilla wedges. Allow to cool approximately 15 minutes. Serve with chilled

For twenty-three million students nationwide, the school day begins and ends with a trip on a school bus. The greatest risk is not riding the bus, but approaching or leaving the bus. Before children go back to school or start school, it is essential that adults and children know traffic safety rules.

Drivers

- When backing out of a driveway or leaving a garage, watch out for children walking or bicycling to school.
- · When driving in neighborhoods with

school zones, watch out for young people who may be thinking about getting to school, but may not be thinking of getting there safely.

- Slow down. Watch for children walking in the street, especially if there are no side-walks in neighborhood.
- Slow down. Watch for children playing and congregating near bus stops.
- Be alert. Children arriving late for the bus may dart into the street without looking for traffic.
- Learn and obey the school bus laws in your state. Learn the "flashing signal light system" that school bus drivers use to alert motorists of pending actions:
- Yellow flashing lights indicate that the bus is preparing to stop to load or unload children. Motorists should slow down and prepare to stop their vehicles.
 - Red flashing lights and extended stop arms indicate that the bus has stopped, and that children are getting on or off. Motorists must stop their cars and wait until the red lights stop flashing, the extended stop sign is withdrawn, and the bus begins moving before they can start driving again.

Children

- Get to the bus stop at least five minutes before the bus is scheduled to arrive.
- When the bus approaches, stand at least three giant steps (6 feet) away from the

curb, and line up away from the street.

- Wait until the bus stops, the door opens, and the driver says that it's okay before stepping onto the bus.
- If you have to cross the street in front of the bus, walk on the sidewalk or along the side of the road to a point at least five giant steps (10 feet) ahead of the bus before you cross. Be sure that the bus driver can see you, and you can see the bus driver.
- Use the handrails to avoid falls. When exiting the bus, be careful that clothing with drawstrings and book bags with straps don't get caught in the handrails or doors.
- Never walk behind the bus.
- Walk at least three giant steps away from the side of the bus.
- If you drop something near the bus, tell the bus driver. Never try to pick it up because the driver may not be able to see you.

Parents

- Teach children to follow these common sense practices to make school bus transportation safer.
- Watch out for suspicious vehicles or persons! Report any suspicious activity to 911 immediately!
