### **COVENANTS CORNER**

# Where do you park your car or truck?

One of the biggest complaints we get here in VOWS is street parking. The streets are the property of the City of Ft. Worth so the association can't enforce it. But we do try to encourage everyone to park either in your garage or in the driveway.

Your vehicles are safest when parked in a closed garage. If you have to park in your driveway, please remember to pull up so your car does not block the sidewalk. It is also prohibited to park any type of trailer, RV, boat, commercial vehicle, etc. in your driveway. If you cannot park them in your garage, you will need to find a storage facility for them.

### Here is what your DCC&R's state about parking:

5.3.18 Vehicles. All vehicles on the Property, whether owned or operated by the residents or their families and guests, are subject to this Section and Rules adopted by the Board. The Board may adopt, amend, and repeal rules regulating the types, sizes, numbers, conditions, uses, appearances, and locations of vehicles on the Property. Without prior written Board approval, the following types of vehicles and vehicular equipment - mobile or otherwise -- may not be kept, parked, or stored anywhere on the Property if the vehicle is visible from a street or from another lot: mobile homes, motor homes, buses, trailers, boats, aircraft, inoperable vehicles, commercial truck cabs, trucks with tonnage over one ton, vehicles which are not customary personal passenger vehicles, and any vehicle which the Board deems to be a nuisance, unsightly, or inappropriate. This restriction includes overnight parking on streets, driveways, and alleys.

This restriction does not apply to vehicles and equipment temporarily on the Property in connection with the construction or maintenance of a dwelling. Vehicles that transport inflammatory or explosive cargo are prohibited from the Property at all times. The Association may effect the removal of any vehicle in violation of this Section or the Rules without liability to the owner or operator of the vehicle. All vehicles parked on any Lot within the view of the public shall be in good operating condition, shall have current license plates, inspection stickers and registrations and shall be in daily use as motor vehicles on the streets and highways of the State of Texas.

Your HOA Compliance Liaison will be doing property drives to ensure everyone is in compliance with the DCC&R's. Please make sure you are not in violation of any parking restrictions.







Candy Cane Cocoa Mix, Diabetic Yield: 2 Cups

1 1/3 Cups Dry Milk

½ Cup unsweetened Cocoa Powder

1/4 Cup sugar free peppermint candy, coarsely chopped

Splenda Sugar Substitute (optional)

Peppermint Stick Candy, optional garnish

#### Directions:

1. In a food processor stir together dry milk powder, cocoa powder.

2. Process until well blended.

3. Stir in the crushed candies.

4. FOR EACH SERVING:.

5. Place 2 Tbsp (or as much as you like) mix in a mug.

6. Gradually add 1 cup boiling water, stirring constantly until crushed candy melts.

7. Add peppermint stick to mug, if desired.



### **Pumpkin Cookies for Pups**

2 cups whole wheat flour
1/2 cup oatmeal
1/4 cup nonfat dry milk
1 teaspoon baking powder
1 cup canned pure pumpkin
1 egg
1/4 cup packed brown sugar



Mix dry ingredients and wet ingredients separately and then combine. Knead dough into a ball; pull off enough dough to make 1 or 2 inch balls, depending on the size of your dog. Roll into balls and place on cookie sheet, flatten with fork in a crisscrossed pattern. Bake at 350 until brown, about 20 to 30 minutes. Cool completely.

### **Gingerbread Cookies for Pups**

½ Cup Molasses 2 TBLS Honey 11/4 Cup Water ¼ Cup Olive Oil 3 Cup Whole Wheat Flour



1 tsp Baking Soda

½ tsp Cinnamon

½ tsp Ground Cloves

1 TBL Fresh Ginger, Chopped

Mix wet and dry ingredients seperatly. Combine wet and dry and form into two balls. Cover and refrigerate 3 to 5 hours. Roll out chilled dough to ¼ inch thickness cut into shapes Bake 350 10-15 minutes. Cool.

### **King of Rock Dog Treats**

2 Eggs

1/4 Cup Smooth Peanut Butter 1/2 Cup Banana, mashed

1 Tbsp. Honey

1 Cup Whole Wheat Flour

½ Cup Wheat Germ or Oatmeal



Mix one egg, peanut butter banana and honey together. Stir in flour and wheat germ, mix well. Work into a ball an turn out onto a floured board, roll out to about a ¼ thickness and cut into shapes. Separate last egg, beat the white until frothy and brush on top of cookies. Bake at 300 for about 30 minutes. Remove from oven and cool.

### **Woodland Springs Homeowner's Association**

The purpose of a homeowners association (HOA) is to maintain, enhance and protect the common areas and interests of the subdivision or neighborhood. Individual homeowners, as members of the association, pay periodic assessments support & utilize neighborhood amenities (pond, pools, parks, tennis courts, etc.). The assessments pay for community expenses such as entrance monuments, landscaping, amenities like clubhouses, tennis courts, or walking trails, insurance for commonly-owned structures and areas, an on-site management company, or any other item delineated in the governing documents or agreed to by the homeowners' association.

Currently, the Advisory Committee, which is comprised of elected residents, is the intermediate group between the residents and the Board of Directors and Centurion American (VOWS developer). This will continue until full development of VOWS is completed. The sub-committees report to the Advisory Committee.
