

VOWS Garage Sale

Villages of Woodland Springs will hold its annual Fall Garage Sale on September 29th – October 1st. Please remember you will need to get a permit from the City of Fort Worth to participate in the sale. There is no cost to do this. You can go to website below to apply for your free permit online or print the form to complete at home.

Garage sales and estate sales are permitted within the Fort Worth city limits, but must follow these rules:

- A permit shall be secured at least 72 hours prior to the sale and shall be prominently posted on the premises during the sale.
- One sign advertising the sale is allowed on the premises only, and must not exceed 2 square feet in size. All other signs, either on or off the premises, are prohibited
- No more than two sales on the same premises in any one calendar year.

VOWS will take care of advertising for the community. We will place large banners around the community. Good Luck to all the sellers!! Remember: One man's trash is another man's treasure.



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
The New 6th Division

By the time this article comes out all the Officers will be hired or assigned to the new 6th Division. Even though the physical location will not be complete until early 2018, the officers will be assigned to the new division starting Saturday August 19. The Officers will use the N. Main location as their sector until the new building is complete. What does this mean for us? With more officers assigned to the area, our response times should greatly improve. The new division will have two Neighborhood Policing Districts (NPD's), named Edward and Frank. Edward will have 5 Beats and Frank will have 7 Beats. Initially there will be 9 Neighborhood Police Officers (NPO's) covering 12 Beats. Three NPO's will service 2 Beats each. Our NPO, Officer Barry Sawyer will have one Beat and will continue to be our Neighborhood Police Officer. Our Beat will become Frank 11. Even though this sounds confusing, it makes more sense when viewing the new Division Map.

The new Facility will be located at 8755 North Riverside. It will encompass 12 acres and house 100 Officers. A new community room will be used for neighborhood and Citizens on Patrol meetings.

We need the Citizen's on Patrol and Crime Watch programs (all apart of community policing) to continue to grow with the growing population. It will take our partnership with the FWPD to keep our neighborhoods safe. We can also do our part by locking our vehicles and keeping our belongings out of sight. The latest crime stats since January show that 87 firearms have been stolen (just in North Division) out of unlocked vehicles and 5 unlocked vehicles have been stolen with the keys left inside!

This month I would like to recognize the residents of Vienna Apple on the North side of Bray Birch for keeping their street well lit. It's great to drive down a street when porches and streets are light and bright. 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
VOWS Safety/Security Committee

* \$200 for each party will be used for food, non-alcoholic beverages and table ware (disposable plates/bowls, cups, napkins/paper towels, utensils)ONLY. Purchase of decorations, craft supplies, games, tables, chairs, etc., will not be included in the reimbursement. Each host will need to keep track of receipts and submit them no later than October 10, 2017 for reimbursement from the VOWS HOA. Reimbursement could take up to two weeks.




Things to Plant in September

FLOWER PLANTS: Ajuga, Alpine Aster, Wax Begonia, Boltonia, Butterfly Weed, Calico Plant, Candytuft, Chinese Forget-Me-Not (Cynoglossum amabile), Cockscomb, Cornflower, Dianthus, Daisy (English, Shasta and Painted), Euryops, Impatiens, Larkspur, Liatris, Lobelia, Petunia, Phlox (divaricata and paniculata), Obedient Plant (Physostegia), Salvia (perennial types), Sedum, Stock, Stokes' Aster.

FLOWER SEEDS: Alyssum, African Daisy (Arctotis), Balsam, Bluebell, Bluebonnet, Calendula, Castor Bean, Cockscomb, Columbine, Cornflower, Cosmos, Daisy, Delphinium, Four-o'clock, Hollyhock, Larkspur, Liatris, Marigold (French), Poppy, Snapdragon, Stock, Sunflower.

BULBS: Allium, Amarcrinum, Calla, Autumn Crocus (Colchicum), Cooperia, Daylily, Dietes, Hardy Cyclamen, Spider Lily (Hymerocallis), Liriope, Louisiana Iris, Ipheion, Lily, Lycoris, Oxalis, Monkey Grass, Rain Lily, Scilla, Watsonia. Purchase tulip, crocus, hyacinth and daffodil bulbs to pre-chill.



VEGETABLES:

Early—Mid Month: Beans, Peas (English & edible pod), and Summer Squash.

Mid—Late Month: Broccoli, Cabbage, Cauliflower, Chinese Cabbage, Collards, Garlic, and Kohlrabi.

FRUIT: Prepare soil now for winter fruit tree planting.

Things to Do in September

FERTILIZE: Feed chrysanthemums every 2-3 weeks until buds appear, then weekly until buds show color. Fertilize roses, gardenias and magnolias.

WATER: Water trees and shrubs deeply and slowly.

DIVIDE: Transplant after dividing: Amaryllises, Callas, Cannas, Daylilies, Irises, Liriope, Wood Ferns.

SOIL: Test soil every 3 years to help plan fertilizer applications. Start a compost pile with fall leaves and yard debris; shred with lawnmower. Replenish mulch in beds.

LAWN CARE: Watch for brown patch in St. Augustine turf as temperatures cool. Lawns with a history of the disease should be sprayed in late month and again in 3 weeks with Terraclor or Daconil. Early morning is the best time to water lawns. Mow every 5-7 days, leaving the clippings on the lawn.

DISEASES/PESTS TO LOOK FOR: Watch roses for blackspot and mildew. Fall webworms are easiest to control when treated early with Bacillus thuringiensis (Bt).

PRUNE: Remove dead and damaged wood from shrubs and trees. Lightly prune pyracanthas so berries will show.

Other Things to Do in September

Trick Poinsettias into blooming for the. Holidays Beginning on the fall equinox (September 21/22) make sure potted plants get 14 hours of darkness every 24-hour period. Use water-soluble fertilizer diluted to 1/4 strength with every watering. Plants should show color around Thanksgiving. At that point, restore them to bright, indirect sunlight and cut back on fertilizer.

September is the perfect time to divide and transplant daylilies, bearded iris, Shasta daisies, violets, wood ferns and cannas. Share extras with friends and neighbors.

Time to groom and tidy up pot plants that have been outside in preparation for bringing inside before the first freeze. Check for insect problems and fertilize before bringing inside.

COVENANT CORNER



Are the neighborhood cats constantly using your garden or favorite rose bushes as a toilet? Many people have trouble with the neighbor's cats digging up their plants, as well as fighting (or other things) on their patios at night.

Even if you have cats, or are just a catlover, there may are a lot of stray cats in your neighborhood. This could be a problem if a stray tom cat has been sneaking into your yard and spraying. After all of this; you end up spending weeks cleaning up after someone else's mess. Wouldn't it be good if you could keep cats out of your yard?

Some common remedies can be poisonous to cats or just downright mean and should be avoided. These include traps and mothballs;

which can cause liver damage to both the cats and your family.

Here are some recipes for homemade cat repellent to help keep your flower in great shape.

- Mix together Vinegar, liquid hand soap and water, in equal parts. Spray it liberally on your lawn.
- Cats seem to run from Rosemary Essential Oil. Mix a little of rosemary with water and spray it onto areas that are problematic.
- 3. Another cat repellent that they seem to hate is a little crushed garlic, cayenne pepper, sugar, water, lemon and cinnamon.
- 4. Plant a bush called Coleus Canina, also known as Scardy Cat. It grows in almost any kind of soil, has grey/green foliage with little blue flowers and when crushed releases a horrible odor. Most cats seem to not be able to stand this plant at all.
- Try mixing 5 tablespoons each of flour, powdered mustard, cayenne pepper and chili powder with 2 quarts of warm water. Mix these together and spray the perimeter of your yard or garden.
- You could also try mixing together 20 drops of lemon oil, 10 drops capsicum (liquid cayenne pepper), 20 drops of eucalyptus oil and 1 quart of water. Mix and shake well.

- Spray on furniture, carpet, upholstery and around your plants.
- 7. Add the juice from the greenest orange you can find to a little warm water and spray the areas you want to cats out of.
- 8. Place citrus rinds and used coffee grounds in your flower beds or garden to keep most critters out.
- Add some herbs to your beds. Add to your garden some citronella, rue, lavender, rosemary or garlic and chives. These are attractive plants but are a natural cat repellent.
- Rub a sliced onion around fence posts or deck chairs and spread the slices around your garden areas.

Remember, when you make your own natural cat repellent that cats have a strong sense of smell. Use this to your advantage as they find some smells less pleasing than others. Try one or all of these recipes and have yourself a beautiful garden!

Individual homeowners, as members of the association, pay periodic assessments, support & utilize neighborhood amenities (ponds, pools, parks, tennis courts, etc.). The assessments pay for community expenses such as entrance monuments, landscaping, amenities like clubhouses, tennis courts, or walking trails, insurance for commonly-owned structures and areas, an on-site management company, or any other item delineated in the governing documents or agreed to by the homeowners' association.

Currently, the Advisory Committee, which is comprised of elected residents, is the intermediate group between the residents and the Board of Directors and Centurion American (VOWS developer). This will continue until full development of VOWS is completed. The sub-committees report to the Advisory Committee. All residents are invited to attend Advisory Committee meetings which are normally held the 4th Tuesday of each month at 6:30pm at the Amenity Center on Timberland.
