



Best Way to Load a Dishwasher

The holidays will soon be here when family and friends gather to eat scrumptious holiday foods and enjoy all kinds of beverages which lead to filling up your dishwasher with glasses, plates, platters and serving dishes. Here are a few reminders for loading your dishwasher for the best cleaning results.

- Place bowls and glasses on the top rack. Dinner plates should be placed on the bottom rack facing the center.
- Plastic containers and drinkware should be placed on the top rack to keep away from heat element.
- Glass serving bowls, casserole pans and large pots should be placed on the bottom rack at an angle as to not block water flow
- Vary flatware placement in the basket to prohibit nesting.
- Utensils too tall for the flatware basket should be placed horizontally on the top rack. Serving spoons should be placed face down on the top rack.
- Knives should always be placed blade side down in flatware basket
- Platters and cookie sheets are best on the bottom rack along the outer edges.
- Appliance and maintenance specialists suggest:
 - » For better results when using dishwasher tabs, place them in the flatware basket for a thorough cleaning.
 - » In order to keep the motor seals working properly, run your dishwasher at least once a week.

Things to Plant IN NOVEMBER

Fall is here! I hope you all had an opportunity to enjoy the pool this past summer. The pool will be winterized soon and non-accessible, by doing this the HOA will save on expenses. Also, with cooler temperatures approaching this is the best time to replace any dead plant material such as trees or shrubs in your yard. Remember you are required to maintain those items year round. Now is also a great time to inspect your fences, paint and stain around windows, doors, patios, play sets and much more.

FLOWER PLANTS: Ajuga, Alyssum, Bluebonnet, Butterfly Weed, Calendula, Candytuft, Carnation, Chinese Forget-Me-Not (Cynoglossum amabile), Cornflower, Dianthus, Daisy (African, English and Painted), Euryops, Forget-Me-Not (Myositis), Gazania, Indian Blanket, Liatris, Nasturtium, Ornamental Cabbage and Kale, Pansy, Penstemon, Petunia, Phlox paniculata, Obedient Plant (Physostegia), German Primrose (Primula obconica), Snapdragon, Stock.

FLOWER SEEDS: Alyssum, Bluebonnet, Calendula, Candytuft, Cornflower, Daisy, Delphinium, Hollyhock, Larkspur, Nasturtium, Pansy, Petunia, Phlox, Pinks, California Poppy, Scabiosa, Snapdragon, Sweet Pea, Sweet William, Verbena, Viola, Wildflowers.

BULBS: Agapanthus, Allium, Alstroemeria, Amarcrinum, Amaryllis (in container), Anemone, Ground Orchid (Bletilla), Calla, Crinum, Crocus, Daffodil, Freesia, Spider Lily (Hymerocallis), Ipheion, Dutch Iris, Spuria Iris, Ixia, Snowflake (Leucojum), Lily, Liriope, Monkey Grass, Muscari, Star of Bethlehem (Orthinogalum), Rain Lily, Society Garlic, Spraxis, Aztec Lily (Sprekelia), Watsonia.

VEGETABLES: Early–Mid Month: Carrot, Chard, Mustard, and Turnip. ALL Month: Lettuce, Radish, and Spinach.

HERBS: Borage, Burnet, Caraway, Catnip, Celeriac, Chamomile, Chervil, Chives, Comfrey, Coriander, Cumin, Dill, Fennel, Fenugreek, Lemon Balm, Mexican Mint Marigold, Mint, Oregano, Parsley, Rosemary, Sage, Santolina, Winter Savory, Sorrel, Thyme, Yarrow.

FRUIT: Strawberries.

THINGS TO DO IN NOVEMBER


FERTILIZE: Fertilize strawberry beds with a 3-1-2-ratio fertilizer. Keep soil moist to promote good plant vigor and berry production next spring.

WATER: Water everything well before a freeze, but avoid overwatering.

TRANSPLANT: Divide and replant crowded perennials throughout the winter months. Transplant chives, garlic and multiplying onions. Now is the best time to move woody ornamentals. Prepare the new site before transplanting.

PREPARE SOIL: Have landscape and garden soils tested now to d etermine soil-balancing needs. Forms are available at the Extension Office, 1600-B Smith Road, Austin, TX, 78721 512-854-9600. C heck winter mulch and replenish if needed. Stockpile leaves for mulch and composting throughout spring and summer.





3 Cups Cooked Mashed Sweet Potatoes (5 or 6 Medium)

½ Cup Sugar

2 Eggs Beaten

½ Cup Milk

1/4 Cup Butter

½ Tsp Salt

1-1/2 Tsp Vanilla

1 tsp Cinnamon

TOPPING:

1/4 Cup Softened Butter

1 Cup Light Brown Sugar

1/4 Cup Flour

1 Cup Chopped Pecans

Bake or boil sweet potatoes, peel and mash with sugar and butter. Stir in remaining ingredients. Pour into greased baking dish. Mix together ingredients for topping and sprinkle on top of potato mixture and bake at 400 degrees for about 45 minutes.

'Tis The Season...For Package Thefts

The busiest time of the year is upon us. Not only for the hustle and bustle of the holiday season, but also for the criminals. The criminal takes every opportunity to steal, even in broad daylight.

Since on-line shopping has become so popular, mail and package thefts have increased in recent years. The number of thefts in Dec. increase 85%, on average.

The criminal is looking for gift cards in mail deliveries, packages delivered to doorsteps and presents left in unlocked vehicles. Don't be fooled by the person passing out handbills in Dec. They may very well be going door to door looking for packages to slip into their shoulder bags. Since the delivery couriers are busy (into the night) the risk of theft is even greater. Be suspicious of vehicles following the delivery drivers or postal trucks.

Here are some suggestions to help prevent neighborhood thefts.

- Do not leave out-going mail in your box for pick up
- Arrange for packages to be picked up by a trusted neighbor while at work
- Track your packages for exact delivery time
- Install a video doorbell or a video security system
- Leave a porch light on at night (save monthly w/ energy-efficient fixtures or bulbs)
- Get the license plate number of vehicles following delivery drivers
- Report suspicious people/behavior/vehicles as soon as possible
- Always lock your vehicles or store them in the garage



Do not leave valuables in your vehicles, in plain sight

If you work from home, are retired, or are a stay at home mom/dad, be a good neighbor and keep watch on your block. Report suspicious activity to the Police Non-emergency number-817 392-4222, or in an Emergency call (911) (for actual theft in progress). If you have had a theft, please remember to report it to the FW police dept. You can place an on-line report when there is no immediate need of an officer at fortworthpd.com.

If you have security cameras, you can register them at the above email address. The police only need your name and address to register your cameras. When crime happens in your area, they will contact you to review your video. It helps them track the direction of travel and look for vehicles that may have been involved.
