FLOWER PLANTS: Ajuga, Balsam, Wax Begonia, Blue Daze, Boltonia, Chocolate Plant, Chrysanthemum, Cockscomb, Copper Plant, Cosmos sulphureus, Gomphrena, hibiscus, Periwinkle, Portulaca, Purslane, Rudbeckia Hirta (Gloriosa Daisy), Salvia, Sedum, Stokes' Aster, Torenia (Wishbone Flower), 7innia

FLOWER SEEDS: Balsam, Blue Lace Flower, Castor Bean, Celosia, Cleome, Cockscomb, Coleus, Cosmos, Cypress Vine, Dahlia (Dwarf), Feverfew, Four-o'clock, Gaillardia (Blanket Flower), Impatiens, marigold, Moonflower, Morning Glory, Periwinkle, Portulaca, sunflower, Tithonia, Torenia, Vinca, Zinnia.

BULBS: Amaryllis, Canna, Crinum, Gingers, Daylily, Liriope, Monkey Grass, and Rainlily.

VEGETABLES: ALL Month: Malabar Spinach, Okra, Southern Pea, Sweet Potato, Peanut, Pumpkin. Start transplants indoors for fall tomatoes, peppers and eggplants.

THINGS TO DO IN JUNE

FERTILIZE: Fertilize annual bloomers with 1 cup of balanced fertilizer per 100 sq. ft. Rich compost, manure tea and fish emulsion are some organic options. Yellowing leaves near the tip of Azalea shoots indicate a lack of iron. Check soil pH and treat with iron supplement. Feed roses and young fruit trees with a nitrogen fertilizer. Feed established annuals and perennials with a high nitrogen/low phosphorus fertilizer such as 12-5-10.

WATER: Water all planted areas deeply but infrequently during dry periods.

Water outdoor potted plants daily.

LAWNCARE: Mow every 5-7 days, leaving the clippings on the lawn. Raise mower setting to reduce stress to turf in summer. Water during the cool of early morning. Avoid weed killers when temperatures are above 85 degrees.

DISEASES/PESTS TO LOOK FOR: Watch for chinch bugs in the sunny areas of your lawn, especially near streets and driveways. Call the Extension Service for recommended treatment. Bagworms and webworms can be treated with Bacillus thuringiensis (Bt). For scale insects, including mealy bugs use summer oil or horticultural oil. Check for spider mites; spray with insecticidal soap.

PRUNE: Remove spent flowers from daisies, daylilies, cannas and other summer flowers. Remove fruiting canes from blackberries after harvest. Tip prune new canes at 4' to promote branching. Prune dead and damaged wood from trees and shrubs as needed. Cut geraniums back place in light shade. Do not prune oak trees at this time since the beetle that carries oak wilt is active now and may enter any cuts you make.

OTHER THINGS TO DO IN JUNE

Prepare fall garden beds. Remove old tomato, pepper and strawberry plants from beds. Replenish mulch.

SAFE SUMMER FUN

The National Center for Missing & Exploited Children recommends that parents and guardians take action to keep their children safe during both structured and unstructured summer activities. The first step is to talk to your children. Kids need to know:

- Neighborhood boundaries and whose homes they may visit.
- Whom to call and where to go in an emergency.
- Their full name, address and telephone number.
- To keep doors locked and not open the door if they are home alone.
- Not to approach a vehicle or accept a ride from anyone without your permission.
- To avoid pools and other bodies of water without adult supervision.
- Their curfew, and to call you if they will be late.

Parents also should remember to:

- Supervise children at malls, movies, arcades and parks.
- Choose and screen babysitters with care.
- Investigate day care centers and recreational camps thoroughly before enrolling your children.
- Always listen to your children.

Are you getting ready to make an addition to your house or build a new shed or fence in your back yard? Before you break out the miter saw, make sure to get your plans approved by our association's architectural committee.

While it may seem arbitrary from an individual homeowner's standpoint, the architectural committee looks out for the entire community. Aside from stopping residents from painting pink polka dots on their houses, the committee's job is to make sure that the size and style of the project, the type of building materials being used and the overall look of the new structure adhere to the association's design requirements. Not only does this keep the community looking cohesive, it also helps to keep property values up by preventing individual structures from standing out. Of course, it's also important to note that unapproved structures might legally have to be removed at the owner's expense, so save yourself money and headaches by getting approval before building.

So when you're ready to start your new project, or if the design of your project changes midway through building it, send your plans to the architectural committee first so that we can make sure they're in compliance with the association's design standards. If we do find any issues, we'll let you know what they are and try to help you come up with other options. We appreciate all the hard work residents have done to make their homes and this community beautiful—help us keep this association looking great by keeping us in the loop of all your building projects.

Late Fees on Past Due Assessments

Semi-annual assessments are due on January 1st and July 1st each year. Please pay the full amount due by January 30th and July 30th respectively, or late fees will occur. Payments can be made online at ClickPay.com, the online payment provider for FirstService Residential. Homeowners can make one-time payments or set up monthly payments

through ClickPay. Payments can be made by e-check (ACH) for free, or by credit/debit card for a small processing fee. Get started by creating your account at www.ClickPay.com/FirstService.

Late fee schedule as follows:

30 Days late: \$270.00 Dues +\$25.00 1st Late fee + \$15.00 Reminder Notice = \$310

60 Days late: \$310 Balance + \$25.00 2nd Late fee + \$15.00 Second Notice = \$350

90 Days late: \$350 Balance+ \$25.00 3rd Late fee +\$80.00 Demand Letter = \$455

A late fee of \$25.00 will be applied each month until the balance exceeds \$800.00. Once the balance exceeds \$800.00, the account will be transferred to the attorney for collection and homeowner will incur substantial additional legal expenses.





- Take note where the reach pole, emergency phone and life preservers are located in the pool area.
- Most importantly, consider learning CPR if you haven't already.
 This simple life-saving technique could save a life should an accident occur.



Schools Out - Staying Safe

By the time this newsletter hits your mailbox the school year will be over. Time for vacations, trips to the pools and fun in the sun. It's also time to watch out for kids playing outside. Make sure there is adult supervision when children are out front playing, going to a park or to a neighbor's home. Get to know your neighbors before you let your child play at their home.

If your child is old enough to stay at home alone, make sure they know not to open the door to strangers. Have them yell through the door or window "No thanks" so the solicitor knows there is someone home. If a solicitor comes to your door and you have a "No Soliciting" sign posted, call the police. Make sure your child has the non-emergency number stored in their contacts. 817 392-4222

Teach your child about criminal mischief. It may seem like fun to toilet paper a home or egg a car but being on the receiving end is no fun and may cause a great deal of damage.

Make sure you know who your teen is driving around with.

Here are some important rules to go over with your child.

- The VOWS parks/pool lots close at 10pm
- Trash should be placed in containers and not thrown in the street
- Speeding and Racing cars is dangerous and against the law
- Under age drinking and illegal drugs are dangerous and against the law
- KISD has on duty security patrolling their property
- Curfew is in effect for teens under 17yrs of age from 11pm Sunday – Thursday and at Midnight Friday and Saturday
- Driving is a privilege not a right
- If you are approached by a stranger,
- 18 yrs and younger must wear a helmet when riding a bike
- Respect the law and the officer

As parents please drive cautiously down residential streets. Know where your children are,



at all times. Have a safe and fun filled summer.

Woodland COMMUNITY POOL RULES


- There is no lifeguard on duty. Swim at your own risk.
- Entry is allowed to residents ages 16 and older with a pool card and photo ID. Children 15 and under are not required to present an ID.
- Children ages 15 and under must be accompanied by a resident, 18 years or older, possessing a valid pool card and photo ID.
- Four (4) guests allowed per residence.
- Proper swimwear is required. Plastic pants must be worn over swim diapers.
- Glass containers, alcohol, pets, and

- smoking are not permitted, coolers are subject to inspection.
- 7. No running, threatening behavior, foul language and/or general activity that may endanger the safety of others.
- No music in the pool area.
- 9. No bikes, scooters, roller blades, skateboards etc. in the pool area.
- 10. No diving.
- 11. No water wings allowed.
- 12. No trespassing after pool hours or during pool closures.
- 13. No unauthorized use of pool restrooms.

- 14. Emergency equipment is to be used for emergencies only.
- 15. Access to the equipment room is restricted.
- 16. For the health and safety of all guests, persons with skin diseases, open wounds, inflamed eyes, nasal or ear infections, or any communicable diseases are not allowed to use the pool.
- 17. Vandalism will not be tolerated. To report vandalism, call the police immediately, and then notify the management company.

In case of emergency, call 911.

The Villages of Woodland Springs or the management company are not responsible for accidents, injuries, or theft. In case of contamination during business hours please call 817-741-1719, after hours call 877.378.2388 Violation of pool rules may lead to revoking of pool privileges and/or criminal prosecution.

BANANAS

Bananas stay fresher when kept together in the bunch vs. separating. Wrap the banana stems with plastic wrap as soon as you get them home for further freshness.



Storing mushrooms in a paper bag will reduce moisture which causes slime.

Place an apple in a bag of potatoes and store them in a cool dark place such as your pantry. Apples create ethylene gas which can help keep your potatoes firmer and fresher a few weeks longer.



TOMATOES

For excellent flavor and a juicy texture, tomatoes should not be stored in the fridge. It is best to keep tomatoes on the counter (away from the sun) to allow them to ripen and reach full potential.



Keep herbs fresh by placing the herb bunch in a glass of water in a windowsill or on your table in a mason jar. After the herbs begin to look a little less fresh, finely chop herbs, and place them in an empty ice cube tray, top with olive oil and freeze for other meals.



To the lengthen the life of berries and kill mold spores give them a bath in 1 cup vinegar and 3 cups of water. After the vinegar bath it is important to dry the berries before storing them in the fridge.



CELERY

Remove the plastic wrapper around fresh celery and wrap celery in aluminum foil. Celery will stay crisper longer.



Apples should be kept in a fruit bowl on your counter. The ethylene gas is bad for other veggies. If you prefer cold apples, store your apples in a plastic bag in your fridge.



Keep avocadoes out on the counter until they have ripened then place them in the fridge. To preserve a cut avocado brush it with olive oil or vegetable oil and seal in airtight container.

Each renter should take pictures and provide them to the office staff to verify the condition of the Amenity Center when the rental is started in order to avoid potential deductions from the deposit amount.


